

School Improvement Plan

The Stillaguamish Valley Learning Center is implementing school improvement practices for all seven Indistar expected indicators in 2017-18. The principal will keep a focus on instructional improvement by working with teachers to implement identified instructional strategies with fidelity. We will provide high-quality professional development through monthly work sessions. Full implementation of new district-adopted curricula is a goal this year. We will also provide an extended learning opportunity for students in grades 6-8 called "Wednesday School." Furthermore, staff will implement district adopted and state interim block assessment tools, while identifying the most effective remote learning curriculum resources. Lastly, we seek to provide a safe and supportive school climate for our community with the help of the Parent Leadership Team. We expect to see well-attended events, regular supervision on campus, parents being vocal about improvements to the program, a clean Family Room, and assisting new home schooling parents with an assigned mentor.
